Acts 2:42-47 CEB

⁴² The believers devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching, to the community, to their shared meals, and to their prayers. ⁴³ A sense of awe came over everyone. God performed many wonders and signs through the apostles. ⁴⁴ All the believers were united and shared everything. ⁴⁵ They would sell pieces of property and possessions and distribute the proceeds to everyone who needed them. ⁴⁶ Every day, they met together in the temple and ate in their homes. They shared food with gladness and simplicity. ⁴⁷ They praised God and demonstrated God's goodness to everyone. The Lord added daily to the community those who were being saved.

Core Commitment: Fuel a Warm Community

<u>Structures</u> alone are not enough to foster warm relationships.

<u>Space</u> needs to be created to fuel a warm community.

Warmth is a dominate gene in the DNA of the church family. Acts 2:42-47

Warmth helps young people <u>find</u> and <u>stick</u> with a church.

Warm intergenerational relationships grow <u>everyone</u> young.

Fostering peer friendships fosters spiritual <u>formation</u>.
