Luke 9:23-24 CEB

²³ Jesus said to everyone, "All who want to come after me must say no to themselves, take up their cross daily, and follow me. ²⁴ All who want to save their lives will lose them. But all who lose their lives because of me will save them.

Core Commitment: Take Jesus 'Message Seriously

<u>Jesus</u> should be at the core and center of our evangelism and discipleship. Matt. 28:19-20 Jesus' message is the <u>Good</u> <u>News</u>, the Gospel, about <u>salvation</u> through faith. Eph. 1:13; 2:4-5.

Belief systems that are missing Jesus' message.

The dominant religious belief system today among young people is <u>moralistic therapeutic deism</u>.

It is <u>moralistic</u>, meaning that religious people equate faith with being a good, moral person.

It is therapeutic, so faith becomes a means of feeling better about themselves.

And it is <u>deistic</u>, meaning God exists, but this God is not involved in human affairs with any regularity.

Golden Rule Gospel: is more about right living than right believing.

<u>Jesus</u> is largely absent from these belief systems.

Churches that are thriving and growing young take Jesus' message seriously by:

Talking more about <u>Jesus</u>. Acts 20:20

Focusing more on the story of $\underline{\text{redemption}}$. Acts 2:14-41

More talk and action concerning transforming lives. Luke 9:23

Ideas for Action

Create <u>space</u> for taking questions, reflecting on scripture, to discovery the gospel story.

Challenge young and old to take up the <u>cross</u> and follow Him.

Tie Each Part of Scripture into the Grand Narrative of God.

Tell <u>your</u> story of redemption.
