






Unhealthy conflict is an impediment to living life to the fullest.


We are being called to a ministry of reconciliation.





Biblical Ways to Deal With Conflict

- Surrender to Christ. (Col. 3:12-15)
- Make every effort to maintain peace. (Eph. 4:3)
- Four G's of peacemaking
 - 1. Glorify God (1 Cor. 10:31)
 - 2. Get the Log Out of Your Eye (Matt. 7:1-5)



Matthew 7:3

3 Why do you see the speck that is in your brother's eye, but do not notice the log that is in your own eye?

4 Or how can you say to your brother, 'Let me take the speck out of your eye,' when there is the log in your own eye?

39 Their argument became so intense that they went their separate ways. Barnabas took Mark and sailed to Cyprus.






40 Paul chose Silas and left, entrusted by the brothers and sisters to the Lord's grace.


















Colossians 3:5–14
