










The Four Primary Causes of Conflict

- 1. Poor Communication
- 2. <u>Differences</u> in values, goals, gifts, calling, priorities, expectations, interests, or opinions.
- 3. <u>Competition</u> over limited resources, such as time or money.
- 4. Can be caused or aggravated by sinful <u>attitudes</u> and <u>habits</u> that lead to sinful words and actions.

10 The thief enters only to steal, kill, and destroy. I came so that they could have life—indeed, so that they could live life to the fullest.


Conflict is not necessarily bad.

Unhealthy conflict is an **impediment** to living life to the fullest.














Colossians 3:12–15 CEB

13 Be tolerant with each other and, if someone has a complaint against anyone, forgive each other. As the Lord forgave you, so also forgive each other.


Colossians 3:12–15 CEB 14 And over all these things put on love, which is the perfect bond of unity.
