Matthew 7:1-5 NIV

¹ "Do not judge, or you too will be judged. ² For in the same way you judge others, you will be judged, and with the measure you use, it will be measured to you. ³ "Why do you look at the speck of sawdust in your brother's eye and pay no attention to the plank in your own eye? ⁴ How can you say to your brother, 'Let me take the speck out of your eye,' when all the time there is a plank in your own eye? ⁵ You hypocrite, first take the plank out of your own eye, and then you will see clearly to remove the speck from your brother's eye.

Conflict

Conflict is a difference in opinion or purpose that frustrates someone's goals or desires.

We are being called to a ministry of reconciliation.

Biblical Ways to Deal With Conflict

Surrender to Christ. (Col. 3:12-15)

Make every effort to maintain peace. (Eph. 4:3)

Four G's of peacemaking

- 1. Glorify God (1 Cor. 10:31)
- 2. Get the Log Out of Your Eye. (Matt. 7:1-5)
- Instead of <u>blaming</u> others for a conflict or <u>resisting</u> correction, we will trust in God's mercy and take <u>responsibility</u> for our own contribution to conflicts— confessing our sins to those we have wronged, asking God to help us change any <u>attitudes</u> and <u>habits</u> that lead to conflict, and seeking to <u>repair</u> any harm we have caused.

Let us take a stand to remove <u>impediments</u> to reconciliation.

Let us commit to living new lives as <u>peacemakers</u> who are <u>patient</u>, <u>tolerant</u>, <u>forgiving</u>, and <u>loving</u>. (Col. 3:5-14)
